



The Ultimate Live/Work Environment

Architect Charles Rabinovitch created this 1,000 square-foot Midtown Manhattan loft for a client who can walk across the hall to his office. The flowing, interconnected living areas serve not only the client's day-to-day needs (he is a single businessman who travels frequently) but is also the site for frequent business entertaining. Though the space is in Midtown and on the penthouse level, the apartment is located at the back of the building for optimum quiet.

Particular attention was placed on the kitchen design, which includes custom cabinetry of anodized aluminum panels and frames. Appliances include a Fisher & Paykel dishwasher, a Northland refrigerator, and a Gaggenau cooktop. The counters are fabricated from sandblasted verde silver granite.

The simple color scheme throughout the home is highlighted by punches of orange. The furniture throughout is from Ligne Roset.
